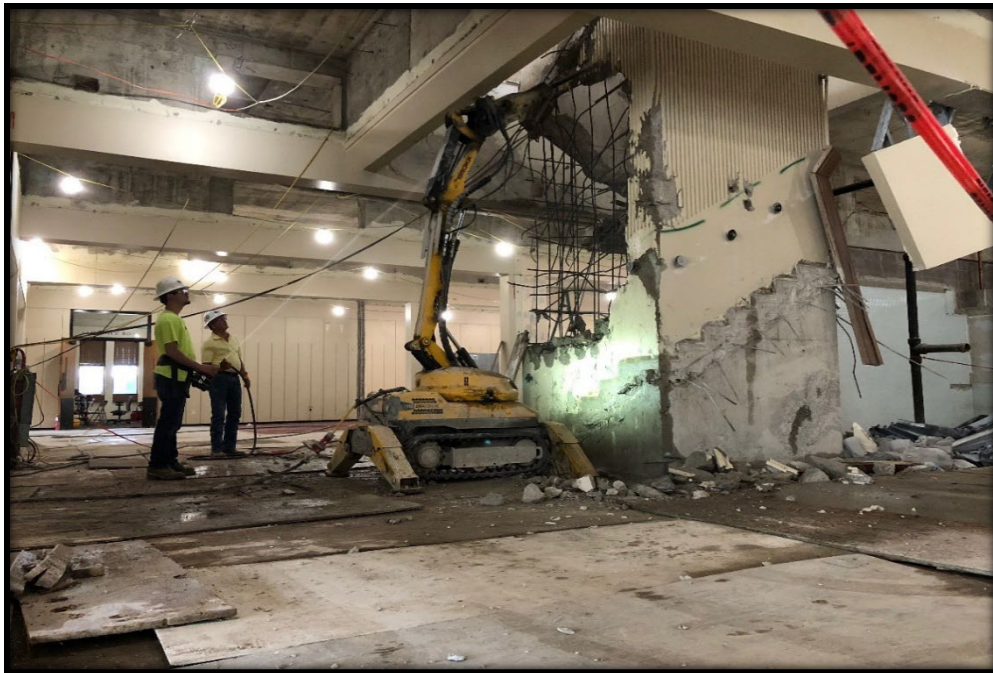

## Structural Demolition

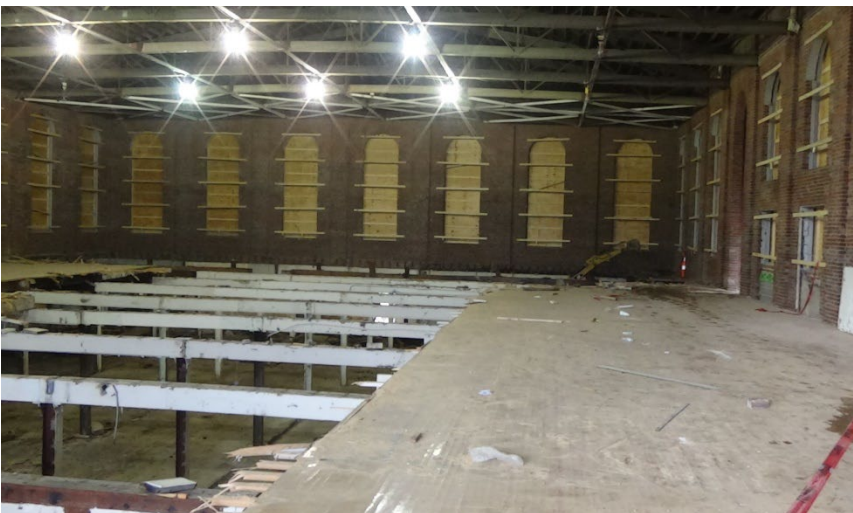

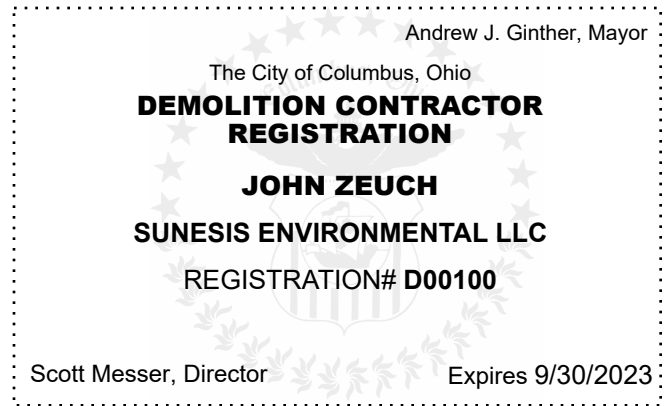

If the revision is via telephone, your company must follow-up with a formal written revision.

Please be advised, your company must continue to maintain records of post-abatement air monitoring results. LEO can and may request these post asbestos abatement monitoring results periodically. Please be reminded that any additional or new employees must be accredited before they engage in any asbestos abatement activities.

To apply for renewal of this license, please submit an application no sooner than 90 days and no later than 30 days before the license expires. The Department must also be notified of any address or ownership changes.
